


Xenith® Official Response to NFHS Rule Change

Last week the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) approved a rule change that states, "In cases where the helmet comes completely off without it being directly attributable to a foul by the opponent, the player will have to leave the game for at least one down." **NFHS Press Release**
